Justin Giarrusso (b. 1991) is a composer of contemporary art music that appeals to diverse audiences, having written in chamber, choral, and orchestral genres. His music is characterized by light textures and is driven by formal structure. The subject of Giarrusso's works range from programmatic depictions of natural phenomena to purely musical explorations within a sound world.

Justin is a graduate of the University of Louisville and Ohio Wesleyan University, where he received an M.M. in Music Composition and a B.A. in Music Theory, respectively. He has studied composition under the guidance of Steve Rouse, Jennifer Jolley, Clint Needham, and Jason Bahr.
